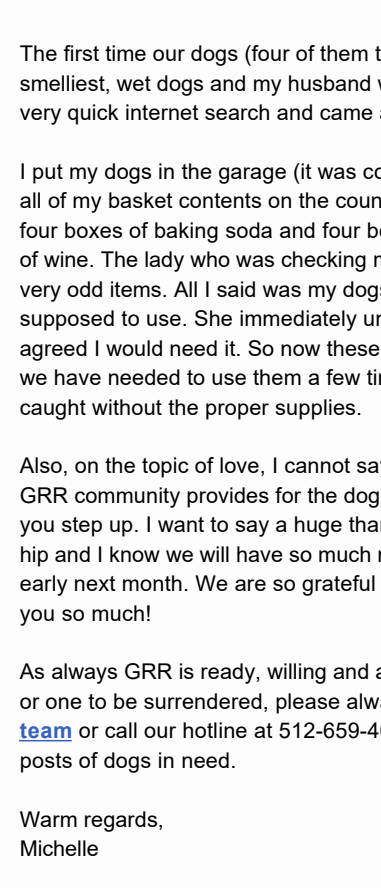

A Message From Our President



Hello friends,

Happy Valentine's Day to you and your loved ones. It is February and love is in the air. Well, at least for skunks it is. Their mating season starts this month, which is why we often see them associated with Valentine's Day. It's a time to be extra careful and watchful because having your dogs sprayed by a skunk is definitely a horrible experience. We have had it happen three times in our suburban backyard. There is a great recipe to use to bathe your dog if they do get sprayed. This concoction is mild dish soap (I prefer blue Dawn), baking soda and hydrogen peroxide. The first time our dogs (four of them to be exact) were sprayed I was in a panic. I had the smelliest, wet dogs and my husband was out of town. I had no idea what to do so I did a very quick internet search and came across what I needed.

I put my dogs in the garage (it was cool enough) and ran to the corner Walgreens. I placed all of my basket contents on the counter, which were four large bottles of the dish soap, four boxes of baking soda and four bottles of hydrogen peroxide, plus a very large bottle of wine. The lady who was checking me out asked what I was doing because I had some very odd items. All I said was my dogs were sprayed by a skunk and this is what you are supposed to use. She immediately understood the need for the large bottle of wine and agreed I would need it. So now these items are always in stock in our laundry room, and we have needed to use them a few times. It is much better to be prepared than to get caught without the proper supplies.

Also, on the topic of love, I cannot say enough about how much I love the support our GRR community provides for the dogs in need that we bring in. Every time we ask for help, you step up. I want to say a huge thank you to all who donated for Charlie to get his new hip and I know we will have so much more support for Amplify Austin that will take place early next month. We are so grateful for all that you give to GRR and to the dogs. Thank you so much!

Important Information About Adoptions

Gold Ribbon Rescue is committed to providing the medical care and vetting of all dogs that find their way into our rescue. The vetting process consists of vaccinations, fecal and heartworm tests, spay and neuter, bathing, nail trim and any other medical needs the dog has. Some of these consist of treating for mange, parasites, ear infections, or even more costly conditions such as orthopedic surgery, dental cleaning with tooth extractions, and heartworm treatment just to name a few.

Although GRR will continue to fundraise in order to ensure the funds are available to treat dogs in our care, with rising medical expenses we must increase our adoption fees. Having a dog fully vetted with a spay or neuter, even with our vet partners' discounts, runs around \$750. Beginning with applications received on or after February 15th, we will increase our adoption fees in order to meet the rising costs of medical expenses. **Please note that the application fee is unchanged at \$25, but the fee will no longer be applied to the adoption fee.** The new adoption fees are as follows:

0-7 years old \$550

8-10 years old \$350

11 years old and older \$250

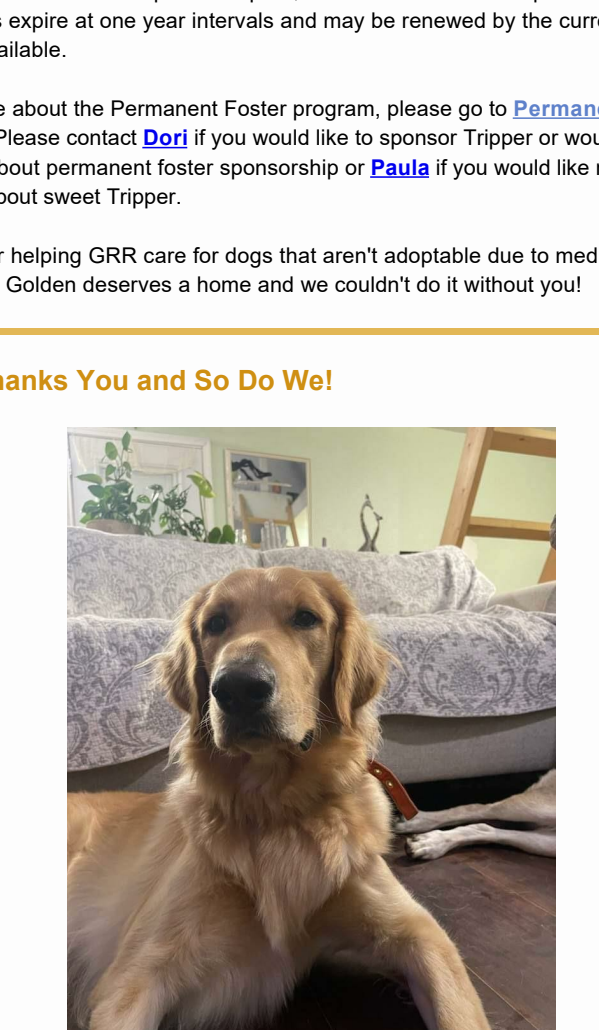
As always, a dog must be medically cleared before it may be adopted. We make all medical records available to the adopter and we disclose all that we know about a dog and any issues. We appreciate the hundreds of families who choose to rescue a pet instead of purchasing one and especially those that choose to adopt Golden.

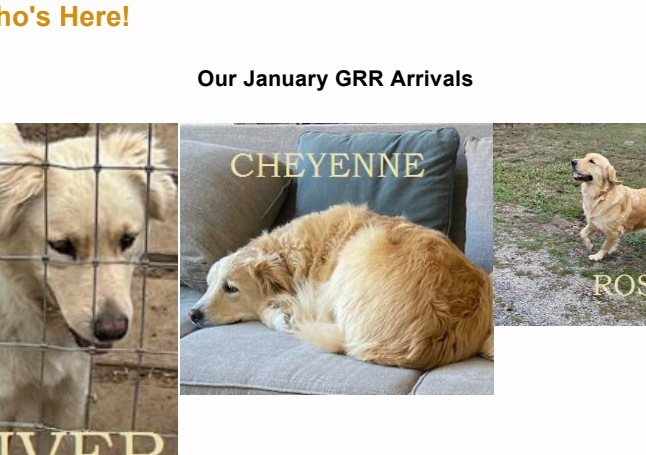

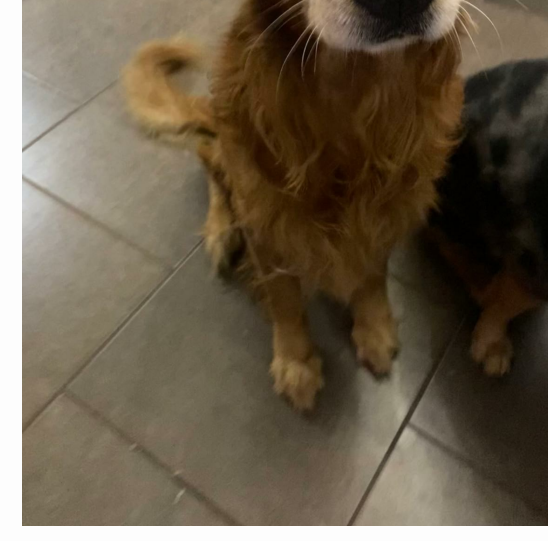

Introducing Our Newest Permanent Foster - Tripper 22-082



Tripper was named a Permanent Foster because of a malignant melanoma that can be aggressive.

Ten year-old Tripper was an emergency intake to GRR because his elderly owner passed away suddenly, leaving Tripper with no place to go. GRR sprang into action, picked him up and delivered this handsome gentleman to the vet for an exam, vaccinations, neuter, and removal of a growth. His elderly owner did not drive so Tripper had not been to the vet for quite some time. Unfortunately, the growth is a malignant melanoma. The good news is that the surgeon got wide margins when removing the growth, so it was a complete excision. This kind of tumor often means months to live, but since it was so small, we are optimistic that Tripper will survive much longer.

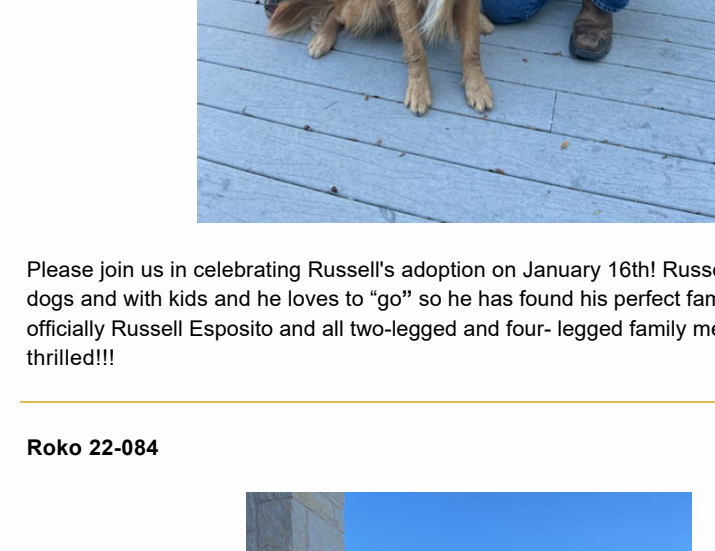
Tripper is enjoying life with his Permanent Foster mom and is getting lots of short walks, cuddles and playtime with his toys. He is a naturally sweet boy and he has an outgoing, friendly personality. Tripper is fairly high energy for his age and enjoys every day of the full life he is in great hands.

Tripper is available for sponsorship or co-sponsorship. Permanent Foster sponsorships help defray the cost of medical care for the permanent sponsor. Golden and are available at two levels. An annual full sponsorship is \$500 and an annual co-sponsorship is \$250. Sponsorships expire at one year intervals and may be renewed by the current sponsor or offered as available.

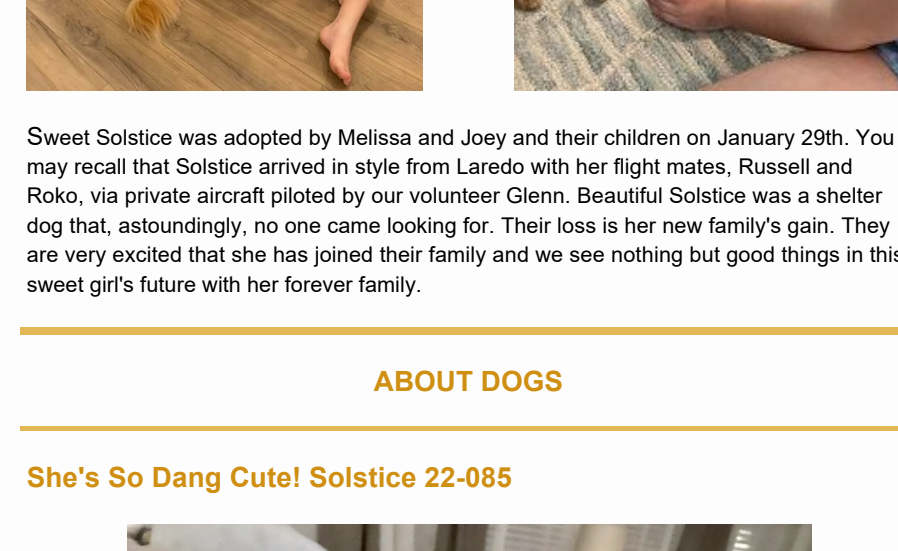

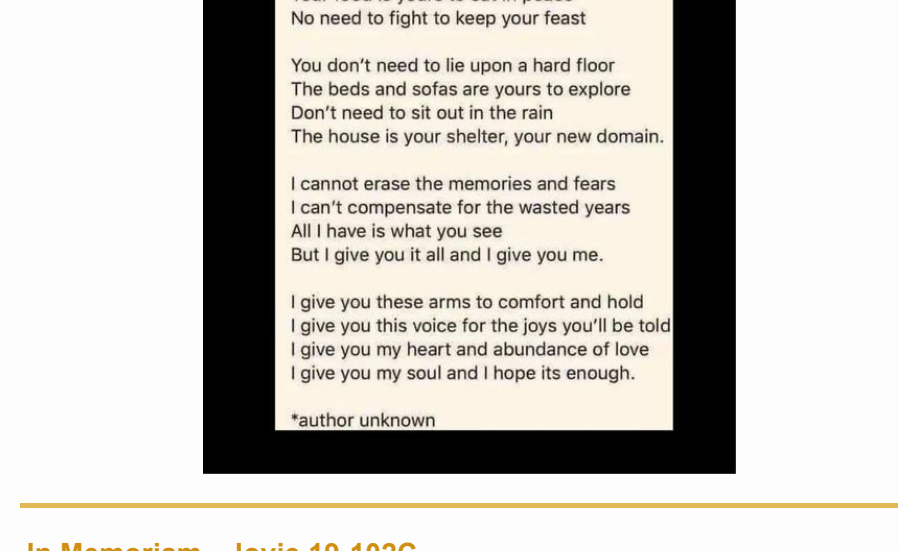
Our January GRR Arrivals

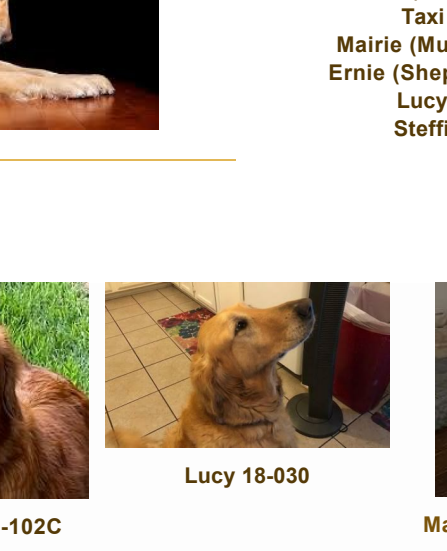
August 22-080

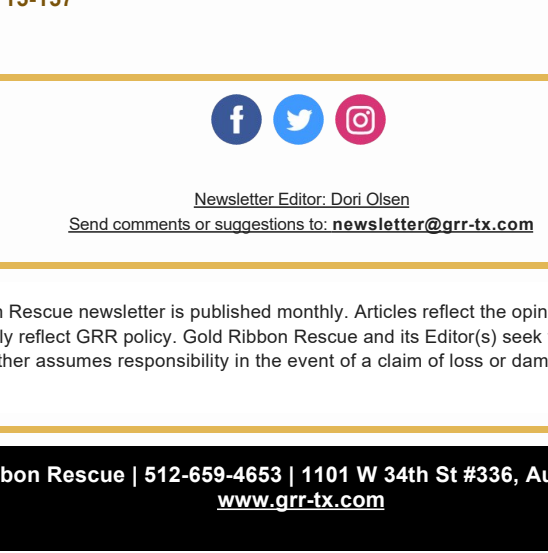


Buddy 22-078

In Memoriam - Jovie 19-102C

In loving memory of our beautiful girl, Jovie - GRR China girl Dixie 19-102C.
Arrived to us 11-9-19. Crossed the bridge to run forever free 1-7-23.

The moment I've dreamed. Telling you we lost our battle.
God is good. Always. He's in control. He alone knew her days and times. And we are just blessed that He gave us the gift of this beautiful girl. We are changed because of her. 3 years. 3 short years. That's it. Her life on earth only 6-12 years. Heartbroken doesn't begin to capture it.

Cuts on Friday, January 7th. Jovie's health declined rapidly. Swelling in her lymph nodes. Byst on her body multiplying 3-4 times their size from a few days ago. Bleeding eyes in her gums. Cancer was destroying her faster than the oncologist could even see us. Our beloved and loving Dr. Ferriss said, "Guys, I hate this, it's time. We can't get ahead of this, it's just too aggressive. It's her body is telling us it's time."

In tears, she told Jovie "you deserved better sweet girl. We are so sorry, baby." Bob and I lay with her, held her, sang over her, prayed over her. We sobbed, we could barely breathe. And then, her suffering was over. But we were shattered. This death has hit me so much harder than even all the rest. Each one painful beyond belief, but somehow this one is different.

As most of you know, this sweet girl spent half her life in a slaughterhouse. Two severe injuries to her eyes and now we know, 13 broken ribs. What kind of human being does this? And then she spent her last few days completely blind. Except to love.

She defied all odds and overcame in six brief years more than probably many of us experience in a lifetime. I learned more from her goodness and overcoming spirit than I see in most humans. We loved her so deeply. We would have given anything to save her.

Thank you for loving her with us and for every prayer you prayed on her behalf. In the end, I pray Jesus said "One sweet Jovie, come run free with me." Jovie, you live in dad and my (and Grandma's and ALL of our) hearts and minds. Forever.

Thank you with all of our hearts Michelle and Gold Ribbon Rescue for rescuing this beautiful girl. So deserving of unconditional love, safety, security and freedom from harm. We were honored and blessed to be her mom and dad. The life she deserved. We are forever grateful.
