We just brought in our 35th dog of the year with three more owner surrenders to come in asap. We are still averaging just about ten dogs a month. We continue to see more young Goldens being re-homed from their owners versus dogs coming from shelters, with the majority being intact. We are also bringing in more males than females.

The downside is adoption applications are really starting to slow down as we are approaching the summer months and people have travel. One constant is that we need applicants who truly have a rescue mentality who are willing and able to bring in a dog that needs training, confidence building and lots of patience. Now is the time to submit your application if you are interested in adopting from GRR.

The GRR 2025 calendar auction starts May 1st. This is a great way to spotlight your babies and help GRR dogs, as 100% of auction dollars go towards the dogs' medical and training expenses. In addition to the calendar, we spotlight these dogs in our marketing materials throughout the year.

Did you attend the Largest Golden Retriever Meetup in Texas last month? There were a record number of 733 Goldens who attended. I was honestly surprised at how well behaved most of the dogs were. GRR is the recipient of fundraising from the event and we will share the details when we have a final number.



We estimate their ages to be 8 months and both are underweight and need to gain between 7–10 pounds. The girls are both with their foster families.

The owner was financially unable to deal with Deej's medical issue, a large mass on his jaw that is possibly malignant, as she is a single mom with a young child who needs surgery. She reluctantly contacted GRR, because she didn't think it was fair to Deej not to receive the medical care that he needs. Unfortunately, Deej was diagnosed with inoperable cancer and was gently euthanized the morning of April 30th with his original mom and his GRR fosters by his side. RIP sweet boy.

Please welcome Jasper 24-033 to GRR. He is a 1-yearold who comes to us from Alamo, TX near the Rio Grande Valley. His owners purchased him from their neighbor who originally bought him to breed. They knew that wasn't in this boy's best interest and they had always intended to find a great home for him and knew GRR would be the best option. 
