We had great fun last time with prizes and more! Let's do it again! And...invite a friend! The more, the merrier!!!



The Nose Knows Kathy Simmons

Looking for something new to do with your pooch?

Consider trying the fun sport of K9 Nose Work (also called Scent Work). Nose Work is inspired by working detection dogs but it's adapted to be enjoyable for our companion dogs. It's a fun activity for virtually all dogs and people. Here are just a few of the benefits:

- · easy to learn and allows your dog to build confidence and focus
- provides a safe way to keep your dog mentally and physically fit

a great fit for todays "new normal" as it lends itself wonderfully to current social distancing requirements. Each handler/dog team works one at a time so it is easy to keep required distances

dogs work through challenges without the stress of competition with other dogs

The primary goal of Nose Work is to have fun! Dogs learn to detect specific odors (Birch, Anise and Clove) in containers, on exterior surfaces, on vehicles, in water, and even buried. Nose Work is a great activity to build a stronger bond with your dog and helps you to better understand how your dog is communicating with you. The great thing about Nose Work is that just about any dog can participate; any size, any age, any physical ability. If he can smell he can play! There are blind, deaf and three-legged dogs who compete at the highest levels of the sport. It is low physical impact and high mental exercise for both dog and handler.

Both of my GRR dogs participate in Nose Work and love it!

In Memoriam - Toby 17-123M Dana, Stephen and Finn Drane



I am writing to let those of you at GRR know that Toby, GRR #17-123M, crossed the

Rainbow Bridge on May 28, 2020. Toby was an interesting Golden to have in our home. He arrived in Austin on a flight from Mexico City. This was on a Sunday, late in October 2017. We drove to Austin on the first Wednesday in November and met Toby for the first time.

Toby was rather shy and he was also a bit overwhelmed by moving to the Texas Hill Country where he had deer to bark at and lots of room to run and get lost in. On one occasion he chased a critter into a brush pile on the acres and it took more than an hour to locate him. Stephen and I both called his name and searched for him. Finally we found him deep in the brush pile, after his prey.

For those of you not in the loop, Toby came to us with quite a list of medical issues. His teeth were almost nonexistent and we had the teeth repaired and cleaned. He also developed hip dysplasia from, we suspect, a previously broken back. He may have been injured in the Mexico City earthquake or he could have been hit by a car that caused his back and hip injuries. According to his birth certificate, at the time we put him down, here at home by the fireplace, his age was approximately 15 years. We wished that he could speak to us of his experiences while living in Mexico City.

On a happier note, during Toby's tenure with us we acquired an English Cream Golden puppy. They became playmates and friends as dogs do. This occurrence made Toby's departure most difficult. Toby is now under our oak grove with Sammy, another Golden rescue (bone cancer) and two Border Collie brothers, Shadow and Blue (dementia and dysplasia at ages 13 and 15).
